After this, weekly newsletters will be posted on our classroom webpage. We will send a weekly reminder via email so you don't forget to checkout the newsletter. We will continue to send a hard copy to those of you that requested one.

<u>Language Arts:</u> This week the children took the Second Grade Baseline Assessment. This will be used as a starting off point in determining guided reading groups. The data from this assessment will also be used as a baseline to monitor growth throughout the year.

We've shared a variety of stories throughout the week: <u>First Day Jitters</u>, <u>Enemy Pie</u>, <u>Never Spit on Your Shoes</u>, <u>My Mourth is a Volcano</u>, <u>The Little Green Dragon Meets the Princess</u>, <u>The Little Green Dragon Feels Mean and How I Spent My Summer Vacation</u>.

The children shared about a summer memory in small, discussion groups. Then they wrote their first personal narrative. We also started using our handwriting books and practiced using the correct grip.

Welcome back to school! Our first full week has been filled with learning routines centered around the PBIS structure and the Heritage Lakes 3Bs:

BE RESPECTFUL,
BE RESPONSIBLE,
BE A GOOD CITIZEN.

We watched a short video about the history of the Olympics and its symbols. We talked about the Olympic values of excellence, friendship, and respect and connected them to school. Finally, we talked about setting goals and working hard. Each student set a gold medal goal for himself/herself.

Social Studies: geography

We began the week by discussing our purpose and goals for second grade. This led to our classroom Mission Statement. From there, we brainstormed the expectations everyone would be held accountable for under the umbrella of Character Counts and PBIS.
