Math

Reading Language Arts

Has your child used the words scarce or *scarcity* with you? Our focus question this past week was, "How can we work together to meet people's needs?" Our main story, Scarcity, by Janeen Adil, helped children understand how scarcity of goods affects people all over the world. We learned about consumers and producers, about having to make decisions (or choices). Our target reading skills was identifying facts & details. This is no easy task! Facts are pieces of information that can be proved to be true. Details are small pieces of information. The children were able to choose one of the texts they've read from this week to identify facts & details. Phonics and spelling patterns we practiced were r-controlled vowels -er, -ir, and -ur.

The children took the Unit 2 Week 3 Weekly test; their results will be on their Reading Street/Pearson account.

We also learned that although most NA work was divided by gender both men and women could have leadership roles. We spent some time during PBL this week exploring different ways to communicate. We learned about Helen Keller whom was blind and deaf and the amazing things she accomplished during her lifetime. Working with a partner (one with eyes closed and the other unable to speak) the students tried to get one another to do something (i.e. sit in a chair, clap hands, touch toes, do jumping jack). Ask your child about this activity and what he/she learned from the experience.

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
