Language Arts: As a way

to wrap up our World Communities unit students wrote informative/explanatory texts in which they were asked to introduce a topic, use facts and definitions to develop points, and provide a concluding statement or section. Students picked a holiday (Chinese New Year, Day of the Dead, Diwali) for this informative piece. Ask your child about the speakers they were fortunate enough to listen to this week. In addition we practiced our keyboarding skills while typing our narratives in the computer lab. Narratives (and illustrations) will be on display during Open House.

Science: After break we will start a new unit called Ecosystems: Interactions, Energy, and Dynamics. Students who demonstrate understanding will be able to:

1. Plan and conduct an investigation to determine if plants need sunlight and water to grow. 2. Develop a simple model that mimics the function of an animal in dispersing seeds or pollinating plants.

Math: Throughout the week students were assessed on their ability to estimate and measure accurately (to the nearest inch/ centimeter). The standards assessed this week were: MD.3-Estimate lengths using units of inches, feet, centimeters, and meters. MD.4-Measure to determine how much longer on object is than another, expressing the difference in terms of a standard length unit. MD.9-*Generate measurement data by* measuring lengths of several objects to the nearest whole unit, or by making repeated measurements by making a line *plot.* As you could tell from this week's homework, we started working with pictographs and line plots. The second graders practiced reading and plotting data on line plots as well as answering questions about pictographs. Please keep practicing those math facts over Spring Break!
