## Math

All second graders took the Otis-Lennon School Ability Test (OLSAT) this week. The OLSAT is designed to measure abstract thinking and reasoning ability. Student scores will be sent home later this school year.
We continue to work through Unit 2: Addition \& Subtraction without Regrouping. The students have been exposed to various mental addition/subtraction strategies (we hope they will soon stop using their fingers) and should be able to solve the following problems: 6+4=? 11-7=? 4+ ?=9 ?-2=10
This week and next week we are focused on addition of two-digit numbers based on place value. One strategy called partial sums works like this:
$45+23=$ ?
Step 1: 40+20=60
Step 2: 5+3=8
Step 3: 60+8=68
